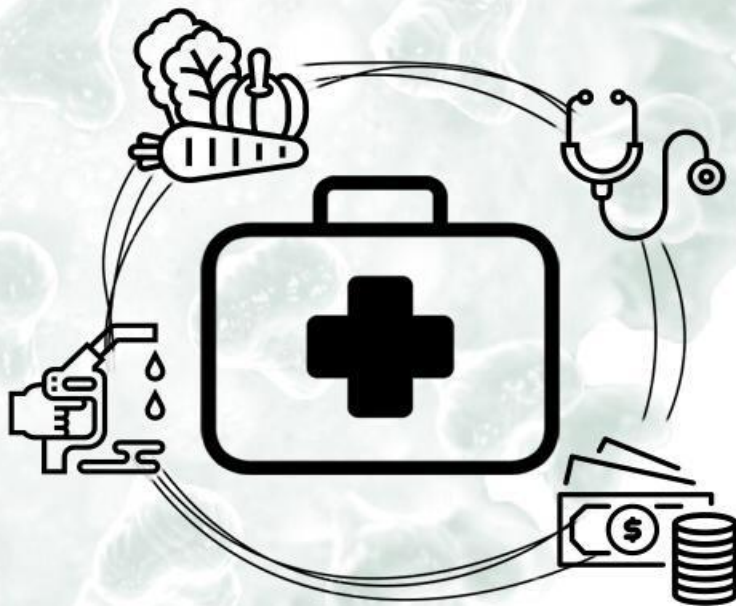


What will I be able to do under lockdown?

The full national lockdown will begin at **midnight on Thursday 26 March**, and will continue for **21 days**.



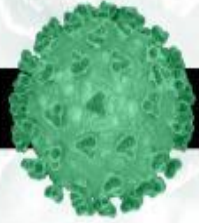
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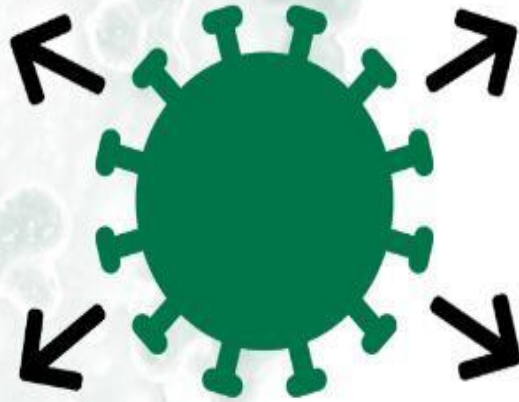

What is the purpose of a lockdown?

The nation-wide lockdown is necessary to fundamentally disrupt the chain of transmission.

It will prevent the spread of the virus and save the lives of South Africans.

The full national lockdown will begin at **midnight on Thursday 26 March**, and will continue for **21 days**.

What is a lockdown?

A lockdown is an emergency protocol that requires South Africans to stay at home except for essential purposes.

Grocery stores, pharmacies, banks and other essential industries will remain open.

All non-essential activities are suspended.

The full national lockdown will begin at **midnight on Thursday 26 March**, and will continue for **21 days**.



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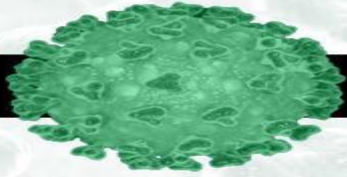

Who will remain at work?



A list of essential services will be published, including pharmacies, banks, supermarkets, petrol stations and health care providers.

Companies that are essential to the production and transportation of food, basic goods and medical supplies will remain open.

The full national lockdown will begin at **midnight on Thursday 26 March**, and will continue for **21 days**.



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Essential services

Possible Extended Essential Services:

Initial list of essential services (DRAFT:
incorporates key categories in both CCMA list
and National Key Points)

- 1. Food production: agriculture, manufacturing and retail**
- 2. Beverages excluding alcohol for human consumption, but including production of alcohol for medicinal or sanitisers and disinfectants**
- 3. Health supplies and health services, including inputs into medications and pharmaceutical companies, and Hospitals and Healthcare facilities; medical suppliers; medical specialists and radiologists; pathologists and laboratories; pharmacies; blood transfusion services and healthcare funders. This covers public and private healthcare sectors and all the support work within these sectors, including maintenance, cleaning, catering, medical records, security, porter and reception, dispensary, laundry, waste removal, engineering, mortuary and pest control.**
- 4. Critical personal, home and industrial cleaning and personal health materials, including soaps, toilet paper, sanitary pads.**
- 5. Banks and finance: SA Reserve Bank; commercial bank branches and core office staff and auto-teller machines; ADD.**
- 6. Retail: food and basic grocery stores, whether located in shopping malls or outside a mall, including spaza shops**
- 7. Electricity: power stations (including coal, nuclear, renewable energy), transmission and distribution**
- 8. Communications: news broadcasting stations, telecommunications companies**
- 9. Water and sanitation: dams, water pipelines, water treatment plants, reticulation services, sanitation systems**
- 10. Transport infrastructure and services: including airports, Transnet facilities. Ports of entry and harbours, Air Traffic Control**

- 11. Oil and petrol: storage, pipelines and refinery, service-stations**
- 12. Animal welfare: emergency veterinary services**
- 13. Public services: court services, correctional services, fire-fighting, social grant payments, **ADD TO LIST**.**
- 14. Private security: services for the protection of property and persons, and essential “back-office” [*to be define in the Act*] services [such as Control Rooms].**
- 15. Care for aged and infirm and associated nursing and general services**
- 16. Inputs industries covering specified chemicals, steel/engineering/other inputs**
- 17. All national key-points**
- 18. All services covered by the Essential Services list of the CCMA**
